Dear Sponsors and Donors

Well, another year is over, and we still face a vastly changing world situation. In the countries where we operate, the COVID-19 pandemic has had a huge impact on poverty-stricken communities. Many of the schools our children attend are in impoverished areas where parents and families are struggling to meet their needs.

Unfortunately, also the mission schools are also struggling as they have not covered expenses due to low or no income from student fees. They have fallen behind in their wages and in some cases, cannot afford to make necessary purchases to re-open the schools.

Thankfully, with the ongoing support of our sponsors throughout 2020 we have been able to distribute over 3000 bags of rice to the children, to the schools and to church workers in India, Bangladesh, Myanmar, Nepal and Zambia.

This has made a significant impact on the lives of church workers who have gone unpaid as well as their children and families. The rice donations will allow mission schools to reopen and ensure that children are fed. We foresee this need continuing a while longer, so we have decided to extend our rice and health appeal with a major announcement coming next month. I want to thank you on behalf of thousands of people that you have assisted with your generous support of Child Impact International in 2020.

We are all truly grateful and thankful.

It is so difficult to predict what the pandemic will do in each area. While some schools have opened, others remain closed. We continue to monitor the situation very carefully. We are once again thankful to our sponsors for their continued support which ensures that our Adventist mission schools can stay open and funds can also help with food.



I remember the single mother that I visited in Bangladesh. She is caring for two children who are sponsored and attend the local boarding school. The children had been away for a year and we took them back to the village to see their mother and she was so excited to see them again.

She had tears in her eyes as she thanked me for your sponsorship of her children.

Not only does your sponsorship ensure an education, it ensures that her children are fed as she can barely raise enough funds to ensure they get sufficient food to eat. We ask that you keep her in your prayers.

This month's newsletter will feature projects you, as sponsors, have helped complete through your support. We are very proud of the work that our field staff have done in India and Bangladesh with projects at the blind school as well as the new KMMS building project.

We ask for your continued prayers for our organization and the work it does to spread the message. We also ask you to pray for our field staff, the teachers, our schools and over 3000 children that we help.

Myanmar Emergency

In recent news you may have heard that the army has carried out a coup against the civilian government. We do not have full details yet, but this seems to have occurred over recent election results. There are widespread demonstrations in the larger cities. In the past, they have never interfered with any religious parties or church schools and we stay hopeful that our schools will remain open as planned.

Currently there are restrictions on internet and telecommunications. Unfortunately, this causes further challenges when getting funds in and out of the country. However, our Adventist mission school systems have seen no problems to date. In the meantime, we will continue to keep you all abreast of the situation and of any changes and ask that you make the situation and protection of the schools in Myanmar a matter of prayer. I wish to thank you for your ongoing support and continued sponsorship.



New Blind School Roof

The roof at the blind school in Bobbili, India was in such bad condition that it was constantly leaking, and roof areas had collapsed. It was also discovered that large areas contained asbestos. The decision was made to completely replace the roof of the school which resulted in a major undertaking.

Under the supervision of the Child Impact International Senior Field Officer, Raj Varma, construction began and now the school has a new metal roof. The new roof will ensure there is no further damage from leaks and provide a safer environment for the children without the presence of asbestos. The blind school currently serves blind and partially blind children that come from some of the poorer communities in the state of Andra Pradesh, India.

Child Impact International is very committed to ensuring safe and suitable school conditions for the children.

We appreciate the ongoing support of our blind school from supporters like you each and every year.

Updates to those that contributed to the gift fund in 2020

In 2020 no gifts were provided to the children due to the Coronavirus pandemic. For those sponsors who paid for gifts in 2020, the money is currently being held in a restricted gift fund at our USA office.

Deaf School Covid Protection

Child Impact International supports the deaf school in Kollegal, India operated by the Adventist mission school system. The Indian government allowed older students to return, but then the local health officials required additional COVID-19 protection. Following a request to Child Impact International, masks and supplies were quickly obtained for protection equipment. It was funded from our "Health and COVID-19 Emergency Fund". This allowed the older students to return to class and focus on completing exams they had missed. The younger children will be returning shortly as the virus number continue to decrease in the area.

Once again, we thank the donors of the COVID-19 Emergency Rice & Health Appeal for their support that also helped return the children to school.



Special Help for Anchorage School & Orphanage in Zambia

When CEO Jim Rennie visited Zambia to establish the sponsorship program at Riverside Farms, he also visited a privately owned Adventist school located in a rural location about two hours from the capital, Lusaka. He was impressed with the school and got a first-hand look at the poor communities it serves. Like other schools it has been hit hard with no student income and is struggling to maintain food supplies.

They placed an urgent request for 200 sacks of corn which Child Impact International supplied immediately.

Child Impact International is also helping with the development of tomato cultivation so that the families can have food to eat as well as generate income.



Child Impact International is grateful to those who supported our "Where Needed Most Fund" and the "Rice & Health Appeal" We were able to help thousands in the short time between October 2020 and January 2021. A brief summary is as follows:

- Food allowances distributed to sponsored children in India, Bangladesh and Myanmar (Over 1,500)
- Distribution of sacks of rice to unpaid teachers and bible workers in India. (Over 750)
- Distribution of rice to needy communities near Sunrise home.
- Distribution to over 100 families in the Vizak slum where we operate a Pre-school.
- Supplies of rice to the blind and deaf schools in India.
- Rice allocation to poor and homeless in Hyderabad, India by the Helen Eager Trust.
- Provision for rice supplies for Adventist Mission boarding schools in India and Bangladesh for when they open. (Over US\$150,000)
- Emergency rice supplies to a community near ESA school, Nepal.
- Allocation of US\$15,000 at Scheer Memorial Hospital for parents of hospitalized children and other patients to receive meals.

KMMS Mission School Building, Bangladesh Project Update

The KMMS mission school building project is one of the largest projects that Child Impact International has undertaken. The project includes a major two-story building that includes a preschool, administration offices, a science lab, a library and numerous classrooms. The project is being supervised by Michael Modal who works for our Bangladesh partner BCSS. There have been some delays due to the COVID-19 pandemic. It has been hard to get labor and material has been in short supply and very costly. The lower floor of the building has been completed and the pylons to support the upper floors are in place. We await the completion of the concrete for the upper floor in the next few weeks.

We look forward to the impact it will have on the areas most needed in Bangladesh and with your continued support we are certain it will progress swiftly.






Rosemary Konkola, Zambia
