Devoki was a top student, completed her studies at Jeypore School and went on to Nuzvid Adventist College where she graduated with a BA in Science.

She has now returned to Jeypore as a science teacher. Arun Panda, Jeypore Principal, says that "Devoki's return as a teacher is so exciting! She is the first student who has returned to teach". The vision of Asian Aid co-founder Helen Eager to help children in these remote villages and the generosity of Garwin McNeilus are giving thousands of village children like Devoki opportunities to have successful careers and to experience and share Christian education.

New Flaiz Bible Worker Program

There is a huge shortage of Bible workers and pastors in India. Asian Aid has partnered with Flaiz Adventist College in Andhra Pradesh to develop a two year Bible Worker program. Following the two year course the graduates commit to work in a church for an additional two years and are guaranteed employment by the church.

Already 33 young people have enrolled! They are excited, energetic, and passionate about sharing the Gospel. But they urgently need sponsors to be able to continue their studies. Madhusudan, one of the 33 enrolled in the program, says "God has been good to me and I have great zeal to work for God. My parents cannot afford to pay the fees. I will work hard and work to the best of my abilities." Others, such as Gowri, have family who have given many years of service to the church. His father worked as a Bible worker and established 14 churches until he died of a stroke in June 2012. Gowri would like to continue in his father's footsteps, but his mother works as a street sweeper so cannot help him financially.

The cost for books, tuition, boarding, food and other costs is \$960 per year for two years, \$1920 for the full two years, or \$80/month.


Asian Aid has a free DVD available which introduces the book and includes two programs on our women's health projects in Nepal.

Growing Pains

Recently we went live with our new database which over time will improve our customer service and information from the field. With data covering over 9,000 children and thousands of sponsors in the USA and Australia, we have had a few "hiccups." If our response has been a little slow or if you have experienced challenges with our website, please be patient with us and feel free to contact us if we can help resolve any issues for you.

With the new database is also a change in child ID numbers which will hopefully result in a better experience for sponsors. Child ID numbers provide children a unique, more accurate identification than names (which often have multiple spellings) or birth dates (as many children in India do not know their birth date). In the past, child ID numbers changed whenever the child transferred schools. However, the children now have a number which will stay with them throughout the time they are supported by Asian Aid. In the transition we will be able to find your child using either number, and you can expect to receive a notification of your child's new number within this year. In the meantime, if you have any questions, please feel free to let us know.

The Gift Annuity marks this decision with two things: the transfer of an asset from the donor(s) to the charity, and the signing of a contract in which the charity agrees to make payments to the donor(s) for life.

In addition to the satisfaction inherent in the act of giving, the CGA adds tangible benefits by providing an attractive income payment, with a significant portion of each payment being income tax free, and an immediate charitable income tax deduction for a portion of the gift.
