## **GREETINGS FROM OUR CEO**

During the trip to Africa, I was able to visit several projects, including a couple in Tanzania. The childhood memories of Grandma Twing collecting funds to carry out mission projects somehow now aligned with my purpose in being there. I'm excited to expand what we are doing in Africa. The opportunity to make a difference for children is significant.

## **GOD IS MY CAMERA**

The grand opening ceremony of the Riverside Secondary School in Zambia took place on Monday, January 10, 2022. This marked the culmination of a vision to answer the question, "What's next?"

For many years, Riverside Farm Institute has operated a primary school for children from pre-school to grade 6. Once this education step was completed, students had to identify other options if they wanted to continue their education.

The celebration drew an audience of dignitaries, school staff, and parents who were curious to see whether this new school provided an opportunity for their children. A significant theme emerged during the various speeches congratulating Riverside on the completion of the school campus. There was a sense that this school was different. One clear indicator of this was staff selection. After reviewing 2000 applications for 13 positions, 98 individuals were invited for a formal interview. The 13 teachers selected embraced an intensive orientation that spanned five months.

As the teachers sang during the opening program, the light on their faces and the joy in their voices exuded a confidence that the students were in great hands. Evans Kasobe Manjimela, Education Director of the Southern Zambian Union Conference, summarized the sentiment well: "Education is more than mastering subjects. There are plenty of smart criminals. Character development is the priority. Character can change a country. It can change politics and corruption." He explained it this way, "When you see money and no one is watching, you look at it and say, that is not mine. God is my camera." It was no surprise that this speaker indicated his desire to send his own children to the newly established school. The guest of honor was a government official designated to attend by the President of Zambia. He also indicated his desire to send his son to the school. The director of Riverside, Craig Harding, announced that there were only a few spaces left for students. The registration office was busy with parents signing their children up as soon as the festivities concluded. How did Child Impact contribute to this special day? First, a significant portion of the infrastructure was funded through our generous donors. Additionally, CII has been sponsoring close to 200 primary students who are now in a place where they can know the answer to the question of "What's next?" Finally, Child Impact is supporting 50 of the new secondary students who have no financial ability to attend school. Another 35 students will be living in a rented dormitory walking distance to the school and will be fully funded through Child Impact's Operation Child Rescue initiative. Their story is shared in this newsletter.

The reminder "God is my camera" is a theme that can transform all of our lives. Character is demonstrated when no one else is looking. There is an awareness that God has called us to a higher standard. Riverside is training students to be world-changers. The influence of this new campus, led by their dedicated teachers and staff will be disseminated far and wide by the students who are blessed to attend. By the way, the question is already being asked... "What's next?"

## **GIFT PROGRAM CHANGE**

Dear Sponsors and Supporters,

These last couple of years have brought with them many challenges and opportunities and we appreciate your patience, support, and prayers as we adapt to them.

For the past few years, we have managed the Gift Program for those sponsors who wish to send their sponsored child a gift. The purpose was to provide an economical process for funds to be sent to the field staff for a gift to be purchased more affordably and to save postage costs. The unintended results of this program are that many children have not received a gift and they feel left out. We also have hundreds of students in our sponsorship program whose expenses are covered through the Unsponsored Child Fund until a long-term sponsor is found. Because they are not being sponsored individually, they have not been receiving gifts while their peers who are being personally sponsored are.

We have identified that it is better for the Gift Fund to cover the cost of Christmas gifts for ALL the children both sponsored and unsponsored in our program, guaranteeing each child will receive a gift. If you sponsor a child, your monthly sponsorship already includes a Christmas gift. This new Christmas Gift Fund will allow us to provide a gift for the hundreds of students who are still awaiting a sponsor. New donations to the Gift Fund after March 1 will be directed to the Christmas Gift Fund unless you inform us otherwise.

## **A VISION FOR THE VULNERABLE**

A tough start in life doesn't mean a lack of options when it comes to Anchor School in Zambia. From the inception of the school in 1998, the founders, Kennedy and his wife Ronnie Mvula, were committed to providing education for orphans and vulnerable children at no cost. How was this possible? A careful balance was established between students that could afford to pay and those that had no resources. Prior to the involvement of Child Impact International, 17 percent of the close to 400 students were classified as vulnerable/orphans.

Additional self-sustaining projects were also undertaken to supplement the required funding to operate the school: growing their own vegetables, milling their own maize, and a recent tomato project (start-up costs funded by Child Impact). Through our sponsorship program, the number of vulnerable children served has increased by 50 students. On these pages, you will see photos of children from Anchor School in Zambia who are awaiting sponsorship. Their smiles reflect the flourishing environment now available to them. Education is their path to a bright future. Your sponsorship is the key to unlocking the door to the path.

## NEW PROJECTI

## **INNOVATION FUNDS MISSION**

Identifying exemplary partner organizations is a responsibility we take seriously at Child Impact International. The commitment to focus on vulnerable children is an overarching motivation that must deeply resonate with any potential new project we support. There is another factor that may not be as easily identifiable, but has a long-term impact on the viability of a partner. How motivated and equipped are they to engage in sustainability projects to support their mission?

The Olmalaika Trust in Kenya gives a snapshot of the kind of entrepreneurial ingenuity that accompanies a strong partner. Rather than 100% reliance on outside benefactors, the team at The Olmalaika Trust have identified successful enterprises that help meet the financial obligations that accompany their work for young girls.

First, it is important to share that the mission of Olmalaika strongly resonates with CII's Operation Child Rescue program. Located on the border of the Maasai Mara game reserve, The Olmalaika Trust functions as a rescue and rehabilitation center for survivors of female genital mutilation (FGM) and those who have narrowly escaped FGM. They also rescue children who have experienced abuse. You will notice two things about the campus immediately, security and beauty. Safety is of the highest priority for these young girls that have been victimized or identified for the illegal and inhumane initiation into womanhood known as FGM (some as young as 8 years old).

The environment at The Olmalaika Trust has been meticulously laid out with shrubs, flowers, trails, and gardens, lending naturally to healing and restoration. Several projects have been undertaken to provide resources for operations. The most obvious are the flourishing gardens and a wealth of papaya trees. An expansive greenhouse features a variety of vegetables and fruits, including an abundance of sukuma (a delicious daily staple that is a type of kale). We also noted a number of beehives and enjoyed some recently harvested honey. The goal is to not only provide honey for use on campus but to also sell in the community.

An additional initiative is the production of reusable sanitary napkins for feminine hygiene. In this cultural context, girls often miss several days of school every month due to their menstrual cycle. The Olmalaika Trust provides health education to the surrounding schools along with a packet of these high-quality products for teen girls. The demand has been so significant that orders are arriving from other countries, producing some income for operations.

A final initiative that we benefited from is their safari business. Due to their proximity to the famous Maasai Mara National Reserve, they offer guests a first-rate tour with "African Springs Safaris" (AfricanSpringsSafaris.com) with fees supporting the girls at The Olmalaika Trust.

Are outside funds still required? Most certainly. However, when exceptional efforts to produce income are observed in action, it assures donors that the project isn't just waiting for a hand-out. Child Impact helps financially support the staff that surround these girls and assists them on their journey to healing. ## **800 STUDENTS RECEIVE SCHOOL SUPPLIES**

The day before this newsletter went to print, Shawn Boonstra, Speaker/Director of Voice of Prophecy, dropped by our office in Ooltewah, Tennessee for a visit. Shawn, and his wife Jean, are ambassadors for Child Impact and have personally been sponsors for many years. Right after his visit, we opened an email from Shohag Boidya, director of our sponsorship program in Bangladesh. Included with the email were inspiring photos of children being provided with school supplies made possible in partnership between Voice of Prophecy and Child Impact. We knew we had to share this awesome, timely story with you. Children received the following items to support them in their studies: pens, pencils, erasers, sharpeners, and colored pencils for drawing and coloring. These packages were delivered to 800 students attending 20 of our partner schools in Bangladesh. We would like to express gratitude to Bangladesh Children's Sponsorship Services (BCSS) for their excellent work on behalf of these precious children. Additionally, we value our partnership with the Boonstras and Voice of Prophecy. Thank you for joining us in providing these essentials for education.

## **BANGLADESH FOOD CRISIS**

The COVID crisis has precipitated an unprecedented challenge for already poor and struggling families in Bangladesh. This has resulted in hundreds of children being dropped off at boarding schools supported by Child Impact International, trusting that they will somehow be fed. Appeals are being made to provide immediate relief for these children. The situation is urgent. Tom Evans (CEO) is planning to travel with Jim Rennie (VP of Special Projects) late this year to assess the situation and determine a long-term strategy moving forward. In the interim, our team feels that food relief should be offered right away. We are initiating our "Health, Rice, and Education" appeal to respond to this crisis. Thank you for your generosity.

## NEW PROJECTI

## **CHASE YOUR DREAMS**

Riverside Farm Institute in Zambia is located south of the capital city of Lusaka on the banks of the Kafue river. Surrounding this slice of heaven are villages where extreme poverty is rampant. The abject poverty and lack of food contribute to the victimization of young girls by truckers due to the proximity with the Zimbabwe border. Others fall prey to illegitimate job offers in the big city that are actually scams to recruit girls for human trafficking. It is a common occurrence for teen girls to disappear from their village homes and never be heard from again.

Child Impact International has partnered with Riverside Farm Institute to develop a solution. A large home located just outside the Riverside property has been rented as a dormitory for 35 at-risk girls from surrounding villages. The property has a full-time security guard and is completely fenced. The girls will have a matron, be provided three meals a day, and receive a fully funded education at the new secondary school at Riverside. Each day, they will be escorted for the 15-minute walk to the school campus. The hope is that someday a dormitory will be built onsite.

Overjoyed with the opportunity now provided to these girls, one parent stated, "Our girls have only worried about food and survival. Now they can chase their dreams." It was a significant step of faith to commit to 35 as the expenses to support these girls far exceed our typical sponsorship amount. The cost to support each girl is \$150/month. Due to the sensitivities surrounding their circumstances, we are not able to provide profiles and letter-writing opportunities as we do with our traditional sponsorship program. We will give regular updates in our newsletter.

Would you be open to supporting one or more of these vulnerable girls? On the enclosed envelope, you will see a special appeal for \$150/month for the girls at Riverside Farm. We will give updates on this initiative, but we are unable to identify the girls by name. Your support is a direct way you can fight human trafficking and the victimization of young girls.



Globally, one in every three victims is a child, but in low-income countries, children account for half of the victims (United Nations). Human trafficking earns profits of roughly \$150 billion a year for traffickers, \$99 billion from commercial sexual exploitation (International Labor Organization).


