It's been a challenging year. We have had many urgent requests on behalf of our sponsored children, orphans, and blind and deaf students which have been compounded by other challenges.

The stories we hear remind us of the struggles some parents face as they try to feed their children. These stories reveal the importance of our ministry. Sadly, two weeks ago, a young girl tried to commit suicide as she saw her parents struggling to provide. We help families and children in situations like this girl and the many children we find living in railway stations or on the streets as they try to survive. With your help, we give them an education, a home, and their basic needs.

I wish you could travel with me; then you would better understand the profound benefits your gifts provide. They go beyond just helping the child who receives the education. Your support also gives the parents a future; when the child returns home better educated, their ability to get work improves. The extra family income helps prevent situations like the story above from happening again.

December is a time of giving – to family, loved ones and friends, and to those in need. Within this newsletter, are four projects with which we need your generous support. Each of these projects is core to the ministry of Child Impact International.

OPERATION CHILD RESCUE

This project operates in India and helps rescue children from brothels and other terrible conditions in which they find themselves.



Blind, deaf and orphans

When another funding agency withdrew support, Child Impact became the primary provider of resources for four orphanages, a school for the blind and a school and deaf run by the Adventist church in India. Without the support from the other agency, Child Impact faces the challenge to meeting the needs of the children in these unique homes and schools.

Un-sponsored children

Child Impact maintains a pool of funds for un-sponsored children. These resources make it possible for us to meet the urgent needs of children needing an education. If a sponsor cannot afford to continue sponsoring a child, these funds are used to allow for the child's continued education. Giving a gift to this pool is a unique way to support a child without a monthly commitment.



- **Trafficking:** In Bangalore India, we support a team who, with the Police, raid brothels looking for young girls trapped in the sex trade. The size of the problem is enormous. Child Impact funds a rescue home for girls, giving them a safe place to live when rescued. Also, assisted are children found in slave labor in factories. Your gift is part of a real rescue !
- **Slum rescue:** Children are living in poverty with parents trapped in poverty. Child Impact gives slum children an education to help rescue them from the poverty cycle. Gifts help provide classroom instruction and a future for children in desperate need. Your gift makes a difference !
- **Baby rescue:** Child Impact works with a baby rescue operation in India. Our partners find homes and loving parents (when possible) for babies abandoned on the street, at police stations, or hospitals. Baby food and supplies ensure life for these abandoned babies.
- **Orphan rescue:** Combining forces with police and other charities we help rescue children and give them immediate help and hope for a future in an Adventist orphanage – providing a home and introducing the children to Jesus.

Story of Shiny Bhaggien

Shiny was born in 1987 in the village of Neyveli in Tamil Nadu to a seemingly happy family. Her father was a well-to-do civil engineer and her mother took care of the children and the household. They owned cows and hens and were envied by families in their small village.

But things took a drastic turn when Shiny was 6-years-old. One day Shiny's father announced that he had met someone while on one of his business trips and was leaving his family. As a result, Shiny's mother, who had no work experience, started going around to people asking for work. She hoped to earn enough wages to feed her little ones.

Three years later, Shiny and her brother had to take a break from school. Upon noticing that Shiny started missing school, her teacher at the Seventh-day Adventist school in Neyveli made a home visit to check in. Seeing their situation, the teacher asked the mother to send her children back to school assuring her that she'd find help. She contacted the local Child Impact partner office in the hope that these two children could have their education sponsored.

As soon as she joined the Child Impact program, Shiny started shooting for the stars. She excelled academically and graduated from high school at the top of her class. With her whole life in front of her, she was ready to fulfill her dream of becoming a nurse. As a baby, a nurse gave her an expired vaccine which led to her developing a physical disability. Since then she dreamed of becoming a qualified nurse to ensure such a mistake wouldn't happen to other babies.

After missing the deadline for the nursing entrance exam, a friend suggested that she work in the Institute of Speech and Hearing Impaired for the year and earn some pocket money for herself. Shiny decided to give it a try. She first set foot on the school premises on a sunny afternoon of June 6 and now 13-years later she continues to work there with her husband, the principal, and their children.

"Before I came to this school, every day was a struggle. I often faced challenges due to my disability and found it hard to find my place in the world. But, when I entered the gates of ISHI on that sunny June day, I found my home," says Shiny. "They say God has a purpose for everyone and here I realized that this was God's purpose for me in life, to love and help these children find a life beyond their disability. Here I saw that whatever had taken place over the years, my sponsorship, my education, my ignorance of the nursing entrance exams all had a purpose."

"I have the best job, the best husband, and I have nothing to complain about. I am so lucky because in this world, it is hard to get true love from one person, but here in this place, I get true love from hundreds of children. I will continue to spend my life trying my best to serve these children through Christ who strengthens me with the hope that this blessing will pass on to them and, on to others," says Shiny.

Sponsorship making a difference "Orphan to Principal of Blind School"

In the year 1981, a little boy, Surya, was born amidst much pomp and circumstance to the Rao family in the village of Yeditha in Andhra Pradesh, India. Sadly, their joys were short-lived. When Surya Rao was just six months old, his father passed away leaving behind a wife, a son, and two daughters. Surya's mother struggled to put food on their table, let alone educate her three kids. So, to ease their mother's burden, Surya's elder sisters stopped attending school and joined their mother and worked to help little Surya attend the local village school. Though he was in school, his education was limited by the school's scarce resources.

While visiting Surya's home, a local pastor saw their living conditions and desired that at least one member of the family should get proper care and education. That way they could help usher in a better future for the family. The pastor told the family about Elim Home in Hyderabad where Surya would be able to get a good quality education and care. The family decided to use this opportunity and sent Surya to Elim Home. 12-year-old Surya began a new chapter of life at Elim Home.

"Here I got good food, a good education and beautiful clothes to wear," says Surya Rao after reflecting on his experience in Elim Home. After completing his high school education in Elim Home, Surya went on to receive a BS in Education, an MS in Microbiology and then he became a teacher in Zaheerabad. Today, he serves as the Principal of the Child Impact School for the Blind.

The 12-year-old boy who entered Elim home with little thoughts of a bright and happy future was given the opportunity to dream and the provisions to make his dreams come true. Aside from his success in academics, Surya Rao also has a beautiful wife Laliitha whom he met while working with Maranatha. They have been married since 2007 and have two beautiful daughters, Betty and Blessy.

Surya received a new beginning because of a single act of kindness. He was a young boy confined to his circumstances by the death of his father and generations of poverty with a new chance at life. While the only future he could see as a child was to till fields and tend to cattle, today he manages and lends his service to 144 blind children who are getting a new chance at life—just like he did. As a young boy, Surya Rao determined to be of service in the places where he was once provided kind and loving service. Today, he is happy to be among the rank of dedicated men and women who serve to give hope.
